Workshop: Oct 28th at the first Christian Church. Marie Hamra was the Special Guest Speaker. She and Her family are from Lebanon. They moved to Greenville in 1984. She has been a volunteer at the Greenville Art Museum. Marie said she enjoys using out of the box techniques to embellish her quilts. She made a quilt for her daughter using a polymer transfer gel medium. Marie explained that polymer transfer technique degrades at temperature extremes. She progressed to using printer fabric images in her art quilts. Marie showed examples of her work using clay sand and beads for embellishment. For thread designing she uses embroidery floss and pearl cotton yarn. Marie enjoys using fabric ink to paint on muslin. Vicki Harrell showed examples of flower photographs she transferred onto fabric. Vicki Harrell will assist members with fabric prints. She will bring her printer to Saturday Sew Day.

The Art-rageous Quilters National Parks quilts were shown at Mancuso MidAtlantic Quilt Show and traveled to additional Mancuso Quilt Show sites. Join us 10a-4p on Tuesday November 5th with Quilter Lori Millsap (Island Time Quilting) as we make the Ocracoke Cracker Quilt Block! Lori is making quilts for the residents of Ocracoke Island using the Ocracoke Cracker Block. Her goal is to make 10 quilts each month and expects to visit Ocracoke in January 2020.

This is a Free Event. Registration is helpful so we know how many to expect.

Our goal is to make 250 blocks.

Bring your Blue, Red, Yellow and Green 100% Cotton Fabric scraps measuring at least 6" square for HSTs and 6 1/2" x 2" for strips!

This is a "come when you can, stay as long as you can" event. We would like each participant to make at least 4 to 6 blocks while they are here. If you want to bring your own sewing machine you are more than welcome to! There will be a couple classroom machines set up as well.

Want to help but don't know how to sew? We will be accepting donations of 100% quilting cotton fabric up until November 1st. We can always use help cutting fabric to the required sizes during the event.

Skill Level: Confident Beginner-should be able to sew an accurate 1/4" seam.



Day of Sharing Saturday, December 7th

Theme: The Night Before Christmas

Favors per guest: Christmas Fat Quarter, Water Bottle Cozy, Tissue holder

We will be making Sun Bonnet Sue Angels for table decorations.

Optional Challenge: Make and decorate a Christmas stocking 6 inches to 18 inches in length Prizes awarded to: Overall Favorite, Most Original, Closest to Theme. Winners will be chosen by attending guests.

Inn at Pine Knoll Shores retreat, Atlantic Beach, NC.



Greenville Quilters Guild 2019-2020 Monthly Raffle Block

This program is like a monthly raffle quilt! Similar to last year, this year we are all making ONE block, but you get to choose your colorway. We will enter your name into the drawing one time for each block you make, and draw both a TRADITIONAL block winner and a MODERN block winner. Two guild members will go home with a nice stack of premade blocks ready to assemble into a quilt top of their own! Participate if you can; it's more fun the more people who join in. We will repeat the drawing at the Day Guild meeting, so you have four opportunities to win (and incentive to attend our Day meeting if you can).



Cut TWO fabrics:

Fabric 1 (Churn Dash) Fabric 2 (Background)

2---4" squares 1-- 3.5" square

4—2"x3.5" rectangles 2-- 4" squares

4-2"x3.5" rectangles

Either choose **TRADITIONAL** prints (any colors) or **MODERN SOLIDS** (Backgrounds should be white or off white.

Churn Dash Block, 9" finished (9.5" unfinished)

A traditional Churn Dash block is a form of a 9-patch (and we are going to focus on 9 inch, 9-patches for the fall, in case you want to make a few extra for a quilt of your own!). It's easy to make in any size that is a multiple of three, like all 9-patches. The basic unit of this block is either a 3" square or a 3" HST (half-square triangle), plus the "Dash" square that is two strips.

Assembly instructions:

Use your 4" print squares and 4" background squares to make four HST units. Trim to 3.5" after sewing and pressing. (This forms triangles 1-2 in the diagram.)

Use your 2"x3.5" rectangles to make four 3.5" squares. (Sew pieces 3 to pieces 4 from diagram.)

Complete your 9-patch variation known as the "Churn Dash Block" just in time for the holidays! These blocks will be exchanged at the JANUARY meetings (both night and day). Spend your holidays stitching churn dashes.
